



The Minutes of the 2012 Annual Meeting were distributed, reviewed and accepted.

# President's Message (Coy Bethune)

Coy shared the following thoughts in his opening remarks:

- -Good year for LiMBO
- -While membership appears to be static or dwindling, the "loyalists" are still having a good time.
- -There were no issues or problems at events in 2012.
- -The LiMBO-Mart was expanded with new items.

## Financial Report (Glen Smith)

Glen was able to attend on videoconference from New Mexico, Glen forwarded the financial reports and copies were available at the meeting. Glen said he is willing to continue as Treasurer.

The financial report summary is as follows:

The financial statements are prepared on a "cash basis" so they reflect only actual balances.

Notes to Financial Statements:

LiMBO lost money again in 2012. Expenses exceeded income by \$1.734. Declining membership dues accounts for the loss in 2012.

The club still has two checking accounts. Glen can close the old account in Maryland when the Paypal coordinator (Jim DiGennaro) redirects the Paypal receipts to the new account in New Mexico.

There was only one bill for the Transporter editor in 2012.

Total combined newsletter related costs remain the largest expense. The largest single expense continues to be for "Internet expenses", followed by money provided to event coordinators

Other Income (primarily Paypal) shows a large increase year over year. The membership dues account had a substantial decrease. The increase in "other income" may be due in part from membership dues being paid via Paypal. Glen has no visibility as to the make-up of Paypal deposits. The Paypal administrator should be able to provide a breakdown of the source of Paypal deposits.

The club ended 2012 with a relatively large cash balance. The club could probably support its activities for another four to five years if there are no significant changes in revenue or expenses.

The financial report was approved and accepted.

- Due to the sporadic newsletter production in 2012, no "delinquent" members were dropped in 2012. Totals may not present an accurate picture of current active members.
- Any renewals that were received were renewed starting with their payment date.

# Newsletter (Jim DiGennaro)

- Mary-Ann Wohlfarth was not able to continue as editor after the spring issue. Jim DiGennaro volunteered to take on the position again and was able to produce two more issues for a total of three newsletters in 2012.
- A lack of content submissions from members continues to be a problem.
- The idea of going to an electronic only newsletter was again discussed. Stan Wohlfarth uses "Constant Contact" for his business newsletter (Stan's Classic Service). Stan's cost is \$15.00 per month. On the downside, there is a limit of 4 photos per newsletter. Stan will see if there options available for more photos.
- A vote was taken and it was decided to go to the electronic newsletter using Constant Contact.
- One more printed version of the Transporter will be published, with the change in format prominently announced. Members will need to make sure that their current email address is on file in the membership database. (Steve Paine spaine 13@comcast.net)
- The goal is to produce a bi-monthly newsletter.
- Dale Ward will work with Steve Paine to put together the mailing list.
- Membership dues will be reduced to \$10.00 per year.

### **Transporter Printing Coordination (Nevin Lescher)**

- The position will be eliminated after the next/last issue of the printed newsletter. Nevin will notify Konica of the upcoming change and thank them for their outstanding service over the years.

#### **Newsletter Advertising (John Reynolds)**

- John has not had any results from his efforts to get advertisers to renew their ads. There are only a few paid advertisers at present
- John will solicit ads for the website from past and present advertisers. The rate will be \$25.00 per year.

# TTT (Transporter Tourist and Traveler Directory)

- No action will be taken this year.
- We will look into an electronic version for next year.
- We have plenty of copies of the last issue available.

# Website (Phil Dlugolecki Webmaster; Jim DiGennaro, Nevin Lescher Web Administrators)

- Phil was not in attendance.
- The website has been getting little action. The perception is that it is getting stale.
- John Reynolds volunteered to scan past tech articles to post on the website.

## **Area Representatives**

- The position of Area Representative /Ambassador will be eliminated.

#### **LiMBO Mart (Coy Bethune)**

- Coy Bethune operated the LiMBO Mart this year and added a number of new items. Items currently available in the Mart include:

- Coy began taking photographs of the items to post on the website, but they came out too dark. New photographs will be taken and Jim DiGennaro will post them on the website.
- Ideas for new merchandise included Cutting Boards and Cookie Cutters. Coy will investigate the feasibility of introducing these items and report back.
- A new batch of Can Cozies will be ordered.
- Expenses for new inventory purchases were \$524.15, sales totaled \$284.75, loss for the year was \$(239.40).

#### **New Business**

## NEATO Closure/Event Insurance

The NEATO Board voted to dissolve the club. George Bossarte (former NEATO board member) noted that NEATO carried an umbrella insurance policy for a cost of \$1500.00 per year. The insurance company would issue separate riders for specific events, and NEATO would receive funds from the event sponsors to defray the cost of the umbrella policy. George proposed that LiMBO consider taking over this service as a means of covering LiMBO events and possibly gaining new members from the now defunct NEATO and event sponsors. Discussion was lively with mixed views for the need to do this since most LiMBO events are held at venues that have their own insurance, i.e. private campgrounds, Museum of Transportation etc. The big questions revolved around LiMBO taking on the financial obligation. who would administer it, the legality of taking over the policy and providing insurance to non-LiMBO members and events. Based on Jim DiGennaro's interest in the program and willingness to be the administrator the following decisions were made:

- Jim DiGennaro will contact Jim Bryant (NEATO treasurer) and J.C. Taylor Insurance to find out the details of the of the operation and find out if it would cover camping events and "get togethers" as well as shows, and if LiMBO would be able to take over the policy/operation from NEATO.
- IF the results of the investigation are positive, then LiMBO will be willing to do a one-year trial.
- Any one who uses the policy will be required to be LiMBO member.

# STRETCHING YOUR IMAGINATION

# T3 (AKA Vanagon) Limousine

You've seen a stretch Limo Hummer, Lincoln and Mercedes? Nothing unusual there, but how many people will believe you when you say you have seen an 8.5 metre long

Volkswagen Bus? And no we are not talking the BBT Split Limo, instead we have a very special car – a scratch built T3 Limo complete with three axles and a sumptuous interior worthy of any Hollywood A lister to be seen in!

It has been built by Christian Lemke and Stefan Schreiber at their garage in Berlin, along with help from good friends Berni, Jense, Kasi,

Steffen, Chrille and Martin. The workshop specializes in Volkswagen busses. When these serious petrol heads get together over a few beers lots of mad schemes get talked about – most of which just remain as crazy ideas. But this one took their fancy and then the question was asked, "Can we do this?" And of course the answer is "Yes we can!"

These boys are serious professionals, and as the idea took hold they were clear about one thing – this would have to be done properly – no home built DIY look! A classy limo would mean quality work. The first job was to take expert advice on the

roadworthiness and feasibility of such an idea, as the vehicle would have to be inspected and tested for legal road use and meet all safety regulations.

Five donor T3 buses were needed to make an 8.5 metre long body, which features a 2.5 metre sliding door! Lots of chassis strengthening and reinforcing had to be welded in to prevent the middle sagging, as VW found with their first bus prototypes in 1949. To provide stability it was decided to fit twin axles at the rear and over 3000 hours of work has gone into the finished bus, but the end result is a real eye catcher! The exterior look is understated, with Ice White paint contrasting with dark tinted windows, black body trim, black headlight surround / grills, black spoiler and smoked glass light lenses. And to ensure the paparazzi are left standing by the curb, a Passat 180bhp V6 TDI en-

gine provides speed and power with an automatic gearbox to make for a smooth ride for the passengers. And of course there are disc brakes behind all alloy rims!

But it's not only the exterior styling and sleek looks that make this bus a bit special – open the huge sliding door for your sumptuous hotel bar on wheels. For complete privacy all the rear windows are tinted

dark, meaning no-one can see what you are getting up to! A luxuriously curvy couch wraps round three sides, upholstered in two tone grey leather, and with a deep red base to bring in some color. Diamond stitch pattern center panels and red piping provide contrast. The curving lines of the top and front seat edges are matched by the curves in the center contrast sections, making for a luxury designer look.

On the sides behind the driver / front cab is the bar, complete with racks for glasses, wine and bottle holders and champagne bucket. The quality lead crystal glasses come in



champagne flutes, classic wine glass or shot tumblers; something for every

tipple. In the center is a huge 47" TV / DVD screen, able to play 3D movies or play video games on the integrated Playstation 3. Bar shelves, speaker cabinets and TV housing are finished in the

same red as the rear couch base and the sound system contains 12 Rainbow speakers and is powered by 4 IPaul amplifi-



ers. LED lights are mounted in the seat base and the roof to provide a variety of ambient lighting settings, and the bar is lit by downlighters to set the mood.

But perhaps the best light comes from another special feature – a huge roof opening skylight.

It is a hard decision if the seat in the cockpit or in the passenger compartment is the best, as the cab area is as luxurious and comfortable as the rear part. Leath-



er cab seat upholstery matches the rear couch and all interior panels have been trimmed in light grey leather with the same diamond stitch design. The dashboard has been made from two



Passat dashboards and covered in black leather to match the T5 steering wheel, whilst red facing to match that in the rear has been used to

frame the entertainment center controls. An extra dash monitor is mated to a camera so that activities in the rear area can be kept a watchful eye on!

The Limo is not just a demonstrator to wow crowds at shows and events however, it is also available for hire for that very special celeb style occasion!

Unfortunately, it was a record low.

The only bus that made it out was my Dad's 75 westy, which was piloted by my brother Brent. My own fleet was grounded at home with minor mechanical maladies that work, weather and other life complications had prevented me from attending to.

I did consider bailing out. Earlier in the week I was more than a little concerned about the weather. As you may recall, the entire northeast took a pretty big beating that week and I had even had to take a "snow day" on the Friday before camp, as the roads near home were just too treacherous for safe travel. But when I awoke the next morning the sky was the that awesome Saturday shade of blue and I just knew I was destined for camping that day. Bus camp needed to be attended to. If I didn't haul the trailer-load of firewood, things would not be pretty.

So we shoveled ourselves out and I borrowed a comfortable all wheel drive SUV and hooked up the trailer and stuffed in a gaggle of teenagers and their gear and off we went. What more can I add? I dunno. If you weren't there, you missed out on a good time. All ten True Canadian Winter Bus Campouts have helped immensely to break up the monotony of a seemingly endless string of long cold winter nights.

# VW's in the news...

# VW Bulli production hopes dead

<u>Volkswagen</u> had a lot going on at this year's <u>Paris Motor Show</u>, including, it seems, dishing to Britain's *What Car? about some* product plans.

VW board member Ulrich Hackenberg has gone on record saying that the <u>Bulli</u> concept van, as shown at the last <u>Geneva Motor Show</u>, is not currently planned for production. That runs counter to <u>recent reports</u> that the German company was considering a vehicle in the small CUV segment that a Bulli might fill, though it doesn't discount the earlier rumor entirely. Hackenberg cites a shortage of demand for a production Bulli as the reason for the project getting shelved. Love for the original <u>Microbus</u> remains high both inside VW and in the public at large, but it remains to be seen if nostalgia alone can be counted on to drive unit sales for something wearing the Bulli's unique shape.

Less surprising is word that VW is going forward with a production version of its groundbreaking XL1 – which makes sense, as we've already seen prototypes in spy photos. The two-seat, 300 -plus-miles-per-gallon car is reportedly earmarked to go on sale in limited numbers. Where and exactly how limited those numbers are remains to be seen.

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
